## AY24-25

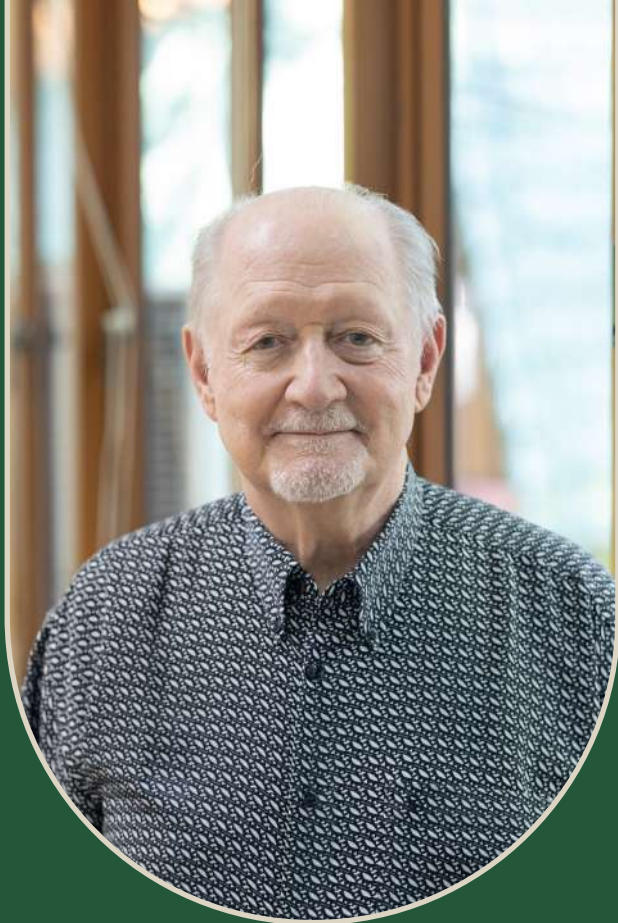
with Excitement and Energy

# DR. SHELDON SHAEFFER

Board of Governors member

Dr. Sheldon Shaeffer, a Board of Governors member at Prem International School, has spent over six decades dedicated to education and development across the globe. Growing up in Minnesota, USA, Dr. Shaeffer's early family travels sparked his lifelong passion for exploration and diverse cultures. His academic journey led him to Stanford University and an exchange programme in Germany, where his interest in global education deepened.

Dr. Shaeffer's career began with the Peace Corps, teaching English in a small school in Malaysia Borneo. His diverse teaching experience in multicultural settings across Southeast Asia laid the foundation for his role as an international development educator. He later pursued advanced degrees at Stanford and worked with prestigious organisations such as the Ford Foundation, UNESCO, and UNICEF in Jakarta, New York, Ottawa, Paris, and Bangkok.

Though retired for 14 years, Dr. Shaeffer remains actively engaged in various networks related to early childhood development, working on projects such as school nutrition programmes in Indonesia. His lifelong commitment to inclusivity, diversity, and the importance of early childhood education continues to shape his contributions to global education.

As a member of Prem's Board of Governors, Dr. Shaeffer is focused on guiding the school to think more proactively about the future. "Prem should not just focus on recruiting students or hiring the best teachers. The key is preparing students for the world they will face 30 years from now," he says. He emphasises the importance of a long-term vision that not only addresses academic learning but also equips students with social and emotional skills to adapt to a rapidly changing world. Dr. Shaeffer notes that Prem excels in fostering this holistic development, helping students navigate the changing ecological and educational landscapes.

Dr. Shaeffer's involvement with Prem began through his connection with Richard Engelheart, a former colleague and currently the Chairman of the Board of Governors, who invited him to join the board after retiring in Chiang Mai. Initially skeptical of international schools, Dr. Shaeffer admits that his previous experiences painted them as catering to a specific group with very little interest in local cultures. However, Prem stood out for its inclusive, holistic approach. "Prem students are more tolerant, and the school develops them into global leaders," he shares, highlighting what sets Prem apart from other international schools in Thailand.

At 78, Dr. Shaeffer remains as passionate as ever, advocating for educational programmes that promote equality and prepare students for the future. His influence extends far beyond the classroom, making him a respected figure in global education development.





# LOY KRATHONG AT PREM

The Thai Department at Prem International School organised the Loy Krathong festival to allow students to learn about and preserve beautiful Thai culture.

Students participated in creating krathongs using natural materials such as banana leaves, flowers, and biodegradable materials, while dressed in elegant Thai traditional costumes.

# GRADE 3 Students Visit Three-Generation Farm

Our Grade 3 students visited The Three-Generation Farm to explore how herbs and plants support the human body, connecting with their unit on body systems. # PREM CELEBRATES AJARN EMMA SHAW'S NEW IB BOOK

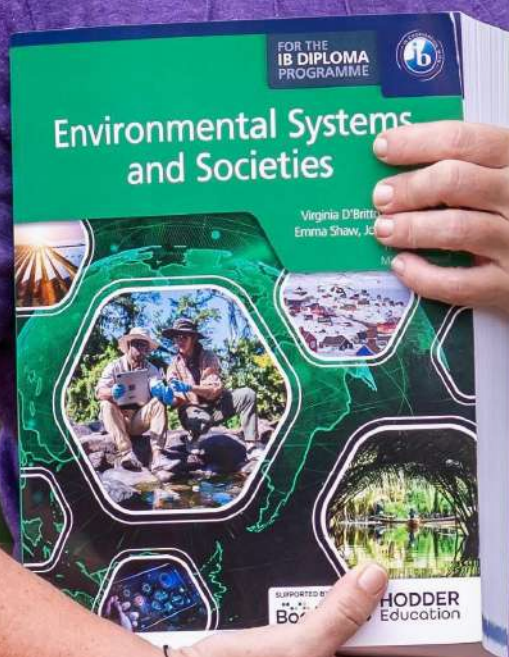

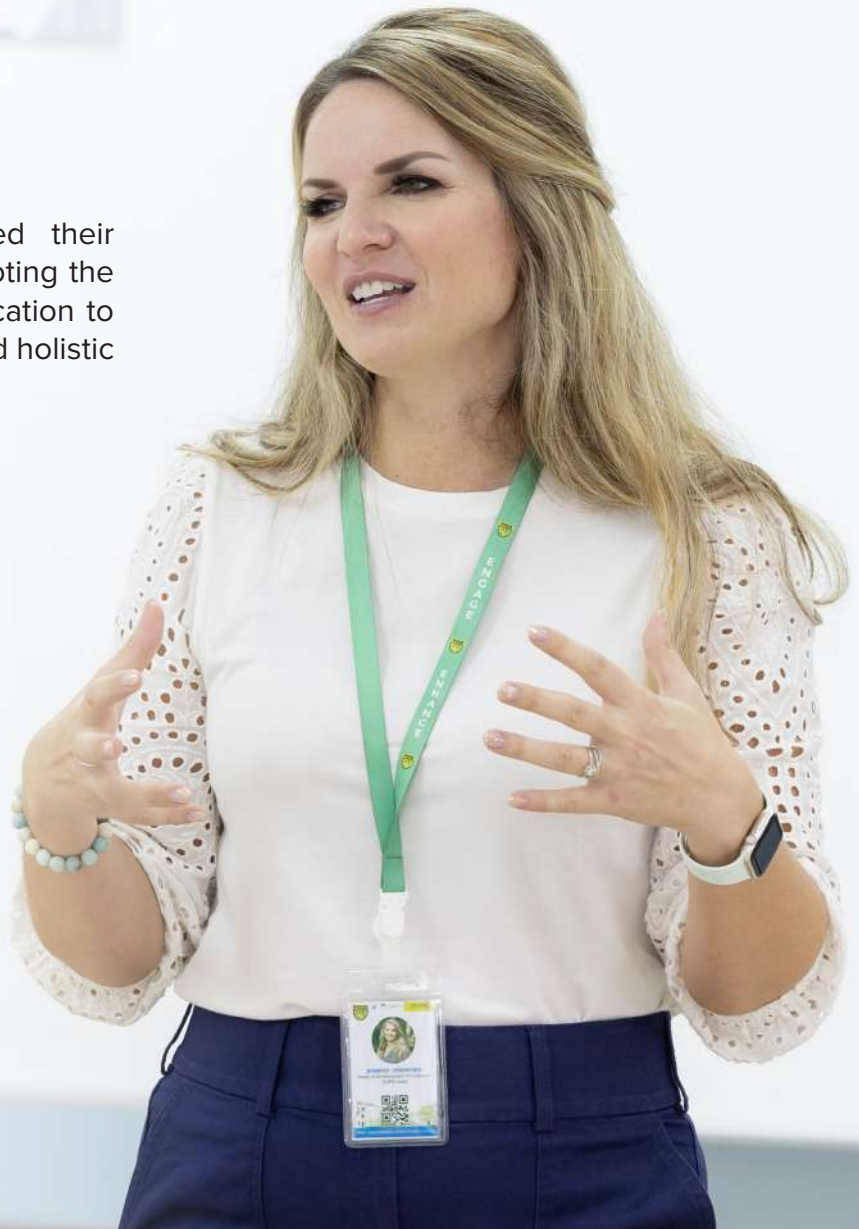
The workshops covered the following programmes:
